Good morning Susan,

A quick update on my dealings so far with regards to the issue on Calder Street, Todmorden.

I have been in contact with Environmental Health regarding Smokes nightclub to check if Smokes nightclub have a trade waste collection in place.

Environmental Health have confirmed that they are not aware if Smokes have a waste contract in place and stated that they do not keep records unless they have been in breach before. Environmental Health did advise that the premises should have a waste contract in place.

Colleagues of mine drove by the area to have a look and found the area to be clean and tidy at the time of the visit. Unfortunately, the premises was closed at the time therefore no contact has been made with the owner.

I made a visit to the area on Friday 24th January where I found cardboard boxes and other bits of rubbish dumped behind the bins. Unfortunately, the premises was closed at the time of my visit.

I have spoken to the company who provide the three red wheelie bins that are on Calder Street. Unfortunately, the company could not disclose who the bins have been contracted to but did advise that they will speak to the business/businesses regarding the area and the waste/rubbish dumped behind the bins to have it cleaned up.

The lady that I spoke to at the company who provide the bins offered to clean the area on their next visit to empty the red bins even though the contract is for glass collection only.

I will keep an eye on the area to ensure that the area is cleaned up and once cleaned, that the area is kept clean.

I trust that this clarifies my position in this matter at this time.

I will keep you updated as and when I receive further information regarding the site.
