(This is definitely a dejavu situation I've been here before 6 1/2 years ago with a little Lidl problem what lessons have CMBC learnt. ?) How is the council going to help the residents of the Halifax Rd? Have they lost the chance? Properties on the Halifax road are shaking and suffered from the numerous floods.

The town plan for the £25mill has now been put forward. Nothing in there about improving the residents situation just making it worse for everyone.

There is a fix although not perfect for Lidl it was suggested that some money went there but disregarded apparently is a different funding source, even though education comes from a different budget the college is up for £1.3mill NOW The last 2 floodplains in this area are planned to be developed.

Lever St a £3 million project by the EA on the shop lock shell shaped car park to contain flood water. Pollination St and Rose St a perfect SUDs and slow the flow system which could be improved with a permeable car park. A hotel next to the EAs £21 million wall.

With climate change and flooding getting worse what is going to be done for the residents already suffering with mental and physical health.
