	£315 and year 3 £4,875 shortfall resulting in over a 3 year period a shortfall of $\pounds$ 1,116.
	Cllr M Holmstedt expressed concern for band A and B properties as to what 5% would translate to - £1.82 and £2.13 per annum increase respectively.
	Cllr D Skelton reminded Members that many Todmorden residents continue to feel financial hardship and whilst last year had not increased precept, recognised the need to set a balanced budget.
