<p>The Todmorden Centenary Ways pack was completed in May 2021. It retails at £5.00, and is sold wholesale at £3.50 (a better margin for retailers than we originally planned). Its launch onto the local walking scene had been pre-announced 'for the New Year' in the December 2020 edition of Valley Life, and it was immediately made available to Todmorden Information Centre; from the on-line shop at The Heart of the Pennines website; at the Book Case in Hebden Bridge and more recently at Wonderfully Made in Todmorden and in the new Halifax Hub in Halifax. Tod Walkers members have also sold copies privately and on a Todmorden Market stall. Unfortunately, because of the uncertainty of Covid restrictions, no formal launch involving the TTC has (yet) been planned.</p> <p>Eventually at least 1000 local and visiting walkers will benefit from the guide. Local retailers reap benefit from the sales. The copyright is owned by Todmorden Town Council so the Todmorden Centenary Way guide (which originated from TTC) can be updated and revised in perpetuity.</p>

Todmorden Town Council support for the TCW guide is acknowledged in several places in the pack itself. The support of the Town Council for walkers is also acknowledged in a related publication, the Todmorden Ways Dinky Map. We posted messages on our website and Facebook page, which were shared.

**What lasting benefit do you think the Town Council Grant has made to your organisation?**

Sales of all TodWalkers publications have increased since the publication of the Tod Centenary Ways guide. The gradual increase in income enables us firstly to continue funding Todmorden’s membership of the national Walkers are Welcome network (which directs visitors to ‘walker-friendly’ towns such as ours) and secondly to develop new projects to benefit Todmorden and its walkers. We continue to work closely with CROWS, also a beneficiary of TTC grants, in keeping our footpaths safe and clearly marked.

**If you have received grants from the Town Council before, please advise how you intend to be more self-sustainable and reduce your reliance on Town Council funding for the future.**

This is the first grant we have sought from Todmorden Town Council – and it was for a project which TTC wanted to have completed, the updating of their original Todmorden Centenary Way Guide.

**If your project had any impact on Climate Emergency what were these and how were they minimised ?**

The TCW project, we hope, has a positive effect in encouraging people to explore and appreciate the beauty of their natural environment. As they do this locally they will also understand more about sustainable forms of energy production, such as wind farms, and see how ‘slowing the flow’ of flood water from the tops can protect the valley below.
