Todmorden Food Drop In has been providing vital support to people in the town for 10 years. The need is now greater than ever and the numbers using the Food Drop In are at a level we could never have anticipated back in 2013. Everyone is welcome, no referrals are needed and people can use the service for as long as they need it. Fresh food such as eggs, cheese, bread, fruit, and vegetables are always available and the range of standard items include different types of milk such as oat and almond, range of toiletries and nappies. In addition, every week there is a free café, and access to different advice organisations. During the winter months we provide bedding and warm clothing and also support people with their individual needs throughout the year.

# How will your project benefit the local community within the Todmorden town boundary? (Use a separate Sheet if necessary).

When people are struggling to make ends meet and face problems at every turn, the Food Drop In is a vital community space which provides a warm welcome, practical support in the way of food bags, the café, signposting to the on-site advice agencies and help with individual needs. We know from talking to people every week, and the user survey we carried out in 2022, just how essential the Food Drop In is to the physical and mental well-being of a significant part of the local community.

Disability Support Calderdale, Newground and Todmorden Emergency Support have all reported on the value of running advice sessions at the Food Drop In, and helping people who may not have received their support otherwise.

# Why is this project needed? What advantage will it bring to Todmorden? How many people within the Todmorden town boundary will benefit from the project?

The grant will be used to pay for the rent we are charged by the Todmorden Community and Learning Hub for use of rooms within the building. If successful, we will provide invoices as well as copies of bank statements to show that the grant has been used to cover the rental costs.

The Food Drop In is needed because many people simply do not have enough money to live on. The situation has got much worse since the cost of living crisis and the sharp increase in every day food items and energy bills.

In 2019 there were **219** households registered with an average attendance of 80-100 households. Currently there are **353** households registered, **557** adults and **344** children. Average attendance is around **140 -160** households with the highest ever recorded figure in February 2023 of **165** households, **236** adults and **145** children. That figure was almost matched this August with **163** households. The number of adults was higher though at **251** and the number of children one less at **144**.

Running the Food Drop In is now a major operation involving 80 volunteers and requiring a huge amount of volunteer time. There are 20 volunteers on duty every Saturday and throughout the week volunteers are buying food and other items, restocking shelves, preparing food for the café, collecting donations from supermarkets, drawing up volunteer rotas, doing funding applications, maintaining the website, Facebook book and other communication channels. During the winter months there is a considerable additional workload of providing people with bedding and matching up donated clothing to individual needs.

The Food Drop In is entirely dependent on grants and support from the local community. Overheads have increased significantly due to the increasing numbers using the service and the sharp increase in the costs of food items. Due to inflation food prices have risen by 25% which has had a direct impact and shape increase in the amount we are now having to pay for the food we give out. Although Food Drop In has reserves of £64,000 the current costs are now around £12,000 per month with expenditure often being about £5000 more than income. It is likely that our core costs

and demand for the service will both continue to increase. There is also the risk that the support we receive from individual and community donations will decrease as the economic crisis continues. The Town Council has supported the Food Drop In with grants over the years, which is very much appreciated. Due to the increasing need for the service and value to the community, we are now requesting a larger grant of £7,000 to help ensure the service can be maintained. We would like to stress to the Town Council that for the last six months we have and are seeing unprecedented numbers of people coming on a weekly basis to get food parcels that are way above the highest amount we have seen in the last twelve and a half years of operating. This is also during the spring and summer months, and we face another winter of increased fuel and food prices. This will impact on in us in two major ways; continuing numbers of people being forced to seek help with basic food items and an increase in the amount it costs us to purchase the food we give out in food parcels. We would also like to stress that the short fall we now face of around £5,000-£6,000 each MONTH from our donations has to be filled via successful grant applications. As a result we are having to look for larger grant funding and also apply for a wider range and larger number of small. This is why your support in agreeing the larger grant would be extremely helpful. We may seem to have healthy reserves but we are extremely conscious that with our monthly deficit; which is likely to increase as numbers of people seeking help increase; this is rapidly reducing and at the current rate if we were unsuccessful in being awarded any grants, would be spent in the next twelve months. The board of trustees have agreed a contingency plan to try and mitigate this on-going issue whilst also trying to maintain the level of support we offer people. This includes reducing the amount of food items given out and once 150 people have attended the remaining people who arrive are given smaller pre-packed bag. Since then, decisions are outstanding for applications to National Lottery, Churchill Foundation and Bremles Trust.

	We have applied to the National Lottery – Cost of Living Fund for £40,000 to cover all food bank costs including our rental costs. We will be told if we are eligible for a grant by the end of October and will then have to supply any additional information required before a decision is made. This money must then be spent by 31 <sup>st</sup> March 2024 and can cover items purchased from 1 <sup>st</sup> September 2024.
	To date we have had no reply or acknowledgement to an initial enquiry sent to see if we could be nominated to apply to the Churchill Foundation. There are no open applications and organisations must be nominated by an individual linked to the foundation. An e-mail was sent at the end of July as we have had no reply, it is unlikely we will be allowed to submit an application.
	We have applied to the Brelms Trust for £18,000 over three years, with the money being used to purchase expensive toiletries (such as female hygiene products and nappies) as well as household cleaning products such as laundry tablets which are expensive to buy. There is no closing date and grant applications can be made at anytime. Decisions are made quarterly throughout the year so we should expect hera from them by the end of October.
