<p>There were 19 applicants to the charities annual grant scheme this year, of which 13 were awarded grants. Of those 13 9 were from Todmorden (69%).</p> <p>Your grant has enabled the Trustees to support young people with real hands-on assistance which will make very significant differences to their lives. Our reserves remain very low; we do not wish to have money in the bank when so many people are struggling. Our running costs are less than £200 pa.</p> <p>We look forward to an increase in applications from youngsters undertaking apprenticeships and similar routes to qualification. We are able to subsidise, with your help, the cost of tools, equipment, safety gear etc.</p> <p>Perhaps Cllrs could be aware that grants are not only awarded for academic study, vocational courses also qualify.</p> <p>I enclose a sample application form for your use. The Heptonstall and Richard Naylor Charities do not cover Walsden and pre 1888 Lancashire addresses.</p> <p>Councillors should note – The Cloughfoot School Trust does cover all Todmorden addresses. It operates in a very similar way and grant forms are available for the charities on the Town Council website under grants.</p> <p>PS in 2023 Trustees became aware that the Vicar of Heptonstall had not preached a sermon on the Feast Day of St John the Baptist and the Chairman consequently refused to sign a cheque for 3 guineas being the usual fee payable according to the will of Richard Naylor in 1609 (not necessary for the report to Council!)</p>
