The grant was successful in that;

- Food vouchers spent in local stores thus increasing footfall in Todmorden and reducing stigma of food parcels being delivered or collected.
- Air fryers building on knowledge of power usage and purchase and instruction from instruction/recipe books and a qualified Home Economist sharing with women’s group and meeting with High School.
- Other ergonomically energy positive electrical items were purchased and distributed throughout Todmorden including in partnership with schools through their well-being staff. These included slow cookers and sandwich toasters/single boil kettles. 33 families/individuals with OL14 postcodes are recorded on CCC data base as in receipt of electrical items plus those in partnership with the schools. These were all delivered or collected directly to families which therefore included well-being contact. Other information re referring on to such agencies as Tod support/ Noah’s Arc as appropriate.
- Networking increased between other support organisations and CCC to enable targeted delivery of the grant.
- Women who were met through identification through the school concerns have joined The Lionesses and now receive access to mutual support and other support processes. Sustainability outcome.

<p>We encourage self- sufficiency within our users. We leave scenarios which maintain a more confident and self-supporting community eg Lionesses which has grown from 3 to around 90 regular users but who take greater responsibility for themselves. From this we also work to build portfolios of experience which helps in future employment.</p>
