### **Please describe what didn't work or needed improvement**

- The group work was a bit disorganised
- Acoustics were very poor, suggest a different venue in the future

- The room was very echoey so it was sometimes hard to hear.
- Interviews at the start and feedback. 1 town councillor asked a question not on any sheet and then left the room without giving feedback to the chair. That wasted my time so only had time to ask 2 people my question and be asked a question by one person. That person did not present my answer (either in general or specifically) in the feedback session and I felt unable to correct that. Session at the end oversimplified Tod Town Council's zones of attention on climate change. I regret the choice I made in haste.

### **Is there anything you would like to add that you didn't get a chance to say during the event discussions?**

- The acoustics were very poor in the room
- Behaviour change (transport, diet, other consumption) was barely raised and yet is crucial in tackling the climate emergency. Given the limited powers that TCC has, influencing changes in behaviour probably provides its biggest opportunity and scope to respond to the emergency. The impacts on climate go way beyond our boundaries when consumed goods, food and services are considered.

### **Please leave any other comments about the event, positive or negative**

- Where is the feedback
- Well facilitated. A good initiative from the Town Council.
- The chair was very good and tried very hard to make it a constructive event. Despite that, I went home feeling deflated by the limited focus of the event and feeling that there had been

little chance to widen it. With all the calls for retrofit in the meeting, it is important that appropriate skills and training are considered. Most local tradespeople do not seem to have a clue on tackling energy efficiency and working in ways that minimise harm to the environment. Tod College is a great resource that has started to tackle this but there is so much more that needs to be done to have the right skills in the workforce.
