Our project has had a slow start, primarily due to difficulty in engaging volunteers, however due to word of mouth we now have 17 volunteers on our books. Unfortunately, many of whom can only volunteer at the weekend, which is not when families wish to have the work carried out, but we do have a team of 8 active and loyal volunteers.

Our contacts with Tod Support sadly came to no fruition, but we now have contact with Disability Support which is proving beneficial to all. We are loathe to advertise our services due to 1. A requirement to assess need of recipient and 2. Being asked for far more than we are able to do.

This has meant that we have been able to undertake less individual jobs than we had hoped.

However it has meant that we are able to return to do more jobs than originally expected at the recipients we do work for. What begins as being asked to decorate a bedroom (and we are all aware that the rooms we are walking through are in an

appalling state), we are asked if we could possibly come back, when we are able to do more work.

The reaction we get from recipients is overwhelming, tears, excitement, massive gratitude and on one occasion speechlessness. One elderly gent began crying, saying I have never in all my life been able to actually choose the colours I decorate my walls! The work we have undertaken is across the length of Todmorden, from Walsden to Portsmouth.

It has enabled TKC to get up and begin running. We need more volunteers and more work and over time I have no doubt this will happen. We have to date carried out 10 projects, many of which have required a number of visits, this has netted 90 volunteer hours and a further 80 coordinator hours two thirds of which have been volunteered. It has meant people who cannot improve their own household environment due to ill health, disability or age are now living in rooms decorated by volunteers to a high standard improving the recipients mental health and pride in their environment. Additionally it has enabled people to enjoy their outside space for the first time in years, including doing a fair amount of the donkey work to enable The Old Library's Garden to become the beautiful productive space it is now.

## If your project had any impact on Climate Emergency what were these and how were they minimised?

Our project is not in and of itself environmentally positive, other than, we share lifts to the venues we will be working in, and we wash brushes and rollers at the end of the day, as opposed to throwing them away as is done in many commercial situations. We had been able to access paint ends from a local decoration company but sadly our contact has now left, we will be trying to make a connection directly with the company in the future.
